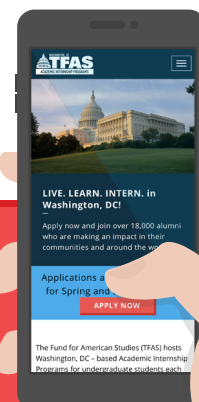
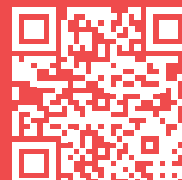

Our Program Tracks



Public Policy + Economics: For students who are passionate about politics and aspire to work in government, law, economics, public policy or the nonprofit sector. Internships are with federal agencies, policy groups, think tanks, Congressional offices, and NGOs. Coursework examines that relationship between economic problems and public policies, as well as American political thought.



International Affairs: Brings together students passionate about global issues and looking to gain experience in the fields of foreign policy, intelligence, international development, diplomacy or national security. Internships are with embassies, international NGOs, policy groups and federal agencies. Coursework focuses on international economics and U.S. foreign policy.



Business + Government Relations: Students learn about the legislative process and how it affects industries around the country and world. Ideal for students interested in careers in business, law, government or public policy. Internships with the government relations offices of major corporations, trade associations and private firms give students an insider's look at how companies and industries represent their interests to the federal government. Coursework dives into public choice economics and ethical leadership.

Journalism + Communications: Aspiring journalists and communications professionals cover issues of national and international importance while interning with newspapers, magazines, radio, news services, corporate or nonprofit communications offices and PR firms. An economics course designed for journalists complements the real world experience.



Leadership + the American Presidency: Designed for students seeking to explore their personal leadership journey through the lens of the American presidency, this program helps participants grow as civic-minded leaders while they intern in the fields of public policy, the nonprofit sector or media. Coursework includes a government course on the American Presidency and economics workshops.
